

Civil Practice & Court Liaison Committee (CPCLC)

- To engage with the Judiciary and other relevant stakeholders for the collective goal of improving the administration of justice, including procedures and systems to enhance the practice in the civil practice areas;
- To foster solidarity among practitioners in relation to their practice in the Kuala Lumpur Courts; and
- To deal with valid complaints and/or issues faced by members of the Kuala Lumpur Bar in relation to their practice in the Kuala Lumpur Courts and the Palace of Justice and to encourage initiatives to help members with various areas of civil practice.

Corporate & Conveyancing Practice Committee (CCPC)

- To identify and assist in resolving issues encountered by our members in corporate and/or conveyancing practices, including matters related to the Land Offices / Registries, Stamp Duty Offices and the Companies Commission of Malaysia;
- To foster relationships and facilitate communication amongst all parties and stakeholders involved in corporate and/or conveyancing practices; and
- To strengthen the legal knowledge and expertise of our members in corporate and/or conveyancing practices by organising seminars, workshops, conferences, training sessions and talks.

Criminal Law Practice Committee (CLPC)

- To engage and maintain continuous communication with the Kuala Lumpur Criminal Courts, the Attorney General's Chambers, enforcement authorities and other relevant stakeholders for the betterment of the administration of criminal justice and to establish guidelines to enhance the practice of criminal law in the Kuala Lumpur Courts;
- To deal with complaints of members of the Kuala Lumpur Bar in relation to their criminal practice in the Kuala Lumpur Courts, while expending efforts to eradicate touting at the Kuala Lumpur Courts; and
- To expose and encourage young lawyers to participate in criminal practice by conducting and organising talks, seminars, workshops and criminal practice mentoring programme.

Gender Equality & Diversity Committee (GEDC)

- To conduct Diversity and Inclusivity training sessions for pupils and organise awareness programmes on gender parity, equality, and diversity.

- To implement initiatives and programmes aimed at curbing discrimination and harassment within the legal profession.
- To promote mental health awareness and organise outreach and engagement programmes with members, external stakeholders, and other state bars to encourage broader conversations beyond professional skills.

Professional Development Committee (PDC)

- To develop and implement Professional Development programmes for members and pupils of the Kuala Lumpur Bar, providing opportunities to strengthen their legal knowledge and stay updated on developments in their areas of expertise, while equipping them with the relevant skills to meet the challenges of the legal profession.
- To promote the importance of continuous professional development in supporting members' overall career growth and advancement while providing sufficient avenues for members to obtain CPD points under the CPD Scheme.
- To develop training and delivery skills for members of the Kuala Lumpur Bar who are interested to be speakers for Professional Development programmes or as speakers or trainers for such other programmes as an extension of their professional practice;

Publications & Communications (PCC)

The Publications & Communications Committee aims to strengthen communication and engagement with members in the Kuala Lumpur Bar Committee. The Publications & Communications Committee focuses on the following areas:

- Digital Platform Management – Overseeing the Kuala Lumpur Bar Website, Membership Management and Payment System, and all social media networks operated by the Kuala Lumpur Bar.
- Publications & Content – Managing and publishing selected materials on the Kuala Lumpur Bar website and Blog.

Pupils Affairs Committee (PAC)

- To foster camaraderie among pupils within and beyond the Kuala Lumpur Bar, while enhancing and improving their professional skills.
- To establish channels of communication with law students through strategic partnerships with law schools.

Social Arts & Culture Committee (SACC)

- To organise events to promote interaction and comradeship amongst fellow members of the Kuala Lumpur Bar, as well as fostering connections with members of the Courts and Government Agencies;
- To organise cultural events and exhibitions to celebrate diversity and promote cultural understanding within the legal community; and
- To initiate fundraising efforts to support charitable organisations and organising community service projects to contribute positively to society.

Sports Committee (SC)

- To provide guidance on modern law firm management, including innovative billing models, remote work strategies and client-centric service delivery.

Young Lawyers Committee (YLC)

The Young Lawyers Committee aims to promote and represent the interests of young members in the Kuala Lumpur Bar. The work and activities of the Young Lawyers Committee focuses on the following areas:
